## P.A. vs Healthcare Management: Which Career is Right for You?



#### I. Role

The tasks of a PA include many hands-on, direct activities such as patient care, prescribing medicines, and lab tests. A health manager's activities are typically more business-oriented, and include quality assessments and control, decision making, and assuring compliance with the law.



### Schooling

For healthcare management jobs, your salary will depend on what your job is, and what your position s within whatever company you work for. The average salary for healthcare managers was reported as \$110,680 per year. A PA salary may also depend on your specialty, and whether you practice privately or not. On average, PAs in CA earn \$127,520 per year.



#### Patient Interaction

Luckily for you, both PAs and health managers have excellent job security. Employment of PAs is expected to grow by 28% between 2023 and 2033, and health management by 29%. Job security and growth-wise, you really can't go wrong with either career.



#### **Specialization**

It is possible for both health managers and PAs to grow their careers. For a PA, this may look like ac specializing or participating in research, while for a health manager, this may look like networking or getting a certificate in healthcare or hospital administration. Remember, the steps you take to build your career should revolve around your specific goals and interests.



#### Career Satisfaction

If you are interested in health management, here are my suggestions: I would explore UCLA's minor (or major! in Public Health so that you can gain useful skills to add to your degree and will be prepared for a graduate program. I would also look into joining campus organizations such as Bruins Public Health for further career information and opportunities. Pre-PAs are in the right place! I would use the

pre-PA club website for further info.

PAs work with physicians and other hospital staff to provide patient care and services. Healthcare managers oversee the day-to-day operations of a healthcare establishment and manage different facilities and their staffs.

#### 2. Tasks



PA school typically lasts, on average, 2-3 years. It is also important to consider that pre-PA students take 1-2 gap years after undergrad before applying. It will typically take 2 years to complete a masters' degree of choice for healthcare management, thus the two are comparable in this sense!

#### 4. Salary



Patient interaction is extremely important in your decision: if you are interested in patient care and want to have a tangible impact on patient lives, you may want to look into being a PA. Heath managers still help patients in a behind-thescenes way through administrative duties. If you'd rather not get up close and personal but still wish to help, management may be a career to look at.

# 6. Job Security



PAs have the unique opportunity to specialize in any kind of medicine they wish! However, you would likely need to complete a fellowship or additional training. Health management careers don't have the same kind of specialization that PAs do, it's more about where you get a job and the duties that come with it.

# 8. Growth Opportunities



70.5% of PAs in all specialties reported feeling satisfied with their career path. In a different survey, health managers rated their career a 3.0 out of 5. Though many were happy with the impact they were making, but reported high stress levels, and some found difficulty maintaining a good work/life balance.
